Camp Pinehurst COVID Protocols as of June 1, 2021

- All campers must do daily health screening 10 days prior to arrival at camp. The COVID Health Screening Form is also attached to this email and this completed form needs to be presented to the camp nurse upon arrival.
- 2) ALL Non-Vaccinated Campers (Or campers who have not tested positive for COVID in the past 90 days) need to have a negative COVID test (Rapid antigen or PCR) 2-3 days prior to arrival at camp.
- 3) Non-Vaccinated Campers will have a Rapid Antigen Covid test upon arrival. The results of this test usually takes about 15 minutes and the campers can wait in their air conditioned car or take a short drive around Crescent Lake to pass the time.

A **Negative** Rapid Antigen test result will allow the camper access to camp.

A **Positive** Rapid Antigen test result will require the camper to **return home and get a PCR test**. Upon a **negative PCR test result, the camper will be allowed into the camp group.**

All Non-Vaccinated Campers will be given a PCR test 3-5 days after arrival to ensure a COVID-Free Camp Bubble. Daily health screening will take place to monitor for COVID-like symptoms.

- 4) Campers who have had a confirmed case of COVID 90 days or less before arrival to camp will not need to have a Rapid Antigen test or a follow-up PCR test. Daily health screening will take place to monitor for COVID-like symptoms.
- **5) All Vaccinated Campers** must do the 10 days of health screening before arrival to camp, but they will not be required to take either the Rapid Antigen test or the PCR test. Daily health screening will take place to monitor for COVID-like symptoms.
- 6) Masks: All Campers will need to arrive at camp with a supply of masks (disposable masks will also be available at camp). Our mask policies are not set in stone at the moment, but all campers will be expected to wear masks at some times.
